3 **Resolution approving Department of the Environment Funding Recommendations for**
4 **Zero Waste grant awards to eleven organizations in grant cycle period (FY 2017 – 2019)**

5 WHEREAS, The Zero Waste program of the Department of the Environment provides
6 grant funding to non-profit groups; and,

7 WHEREAS, the Zero Waste grant program is dedicated to funding projects that recover
8 material from San Francisco’s landfill, thereby assisting the City in achieving its goal of zero
9 waste, and achieving this at a low cost per ton of waste diverted; and,

10 WHEREAS, in addition to helping San Francisco reach its zero waste goals, these
11 grant funded projects achieve a range of co-benefits such as creating jobs, providing
12 classroom materials for educators, securing healthy food and books for low-income San
13 Franciscans, and building community; now, therefore, be it

14 RESOLVED, the Commission approves the award of Zero Waste grants, totaling
15 \$857,000 to be disbursed during FY 2017-2019 to the following organizations:
