9. Discussion on material reuse and the 2019 Urban Wood Academy. Speakers: Jon Swae, Principle Analyst, Bureau of Urban Forestry, Department of Public Works (Discussion)

Jon Swae, Bureau of Urban Forestry, discussed a recent trip to attend the US Forest Service Urban Wood Academy in Baltimore, MD. Jon explained the definition of urban wood, the history of urban wood in San Francisco versus Baltimore, Baltimore's regulations, and opportunities for wood reuse. Lesson learned included the benefits of social enterprise, need for partnerships and the need for tree processing locations.

Member Nicholas Crawford asked about the demand and opportunities for the use of urban wood.

Jon Swae discussed both indoor and outdoor applications for the wood.

Tom Carter asked about what opportunities exist for the trees in San Francisco.

Jon Swae discussed uses for specific San Francisco tree species.

Tom Carter discussed supply and funding.

Jon Swae discussed the breadth of issues with processing.

Damon Spigelman asked how long this program took to develop in Baltimore and the funding for it.

Member Ildiko Polony asked what the biggest barriers are to implement this in San Francisco.

Jon Swae discussed the limitations of space for storage and need to develop partnerships.

Blake Troxel discussed funding and resources.

Member Ildiko Polony asked if the US Forest Service is available to partner with other cities.

Member Igor Lacan discussed potential US Forest Service partnership.

Jon Swae discussed building deconstruction, use, working group and contractors.

Andrew Sullivan discussed bundling resources and partnerships for tree processing.

Member Nicholas Crawford discussed monetary value in reuse of trees.

Member Igor Lacan discussed the differences between the implementation of this program in Baltimore versus San Francisco.

Member Nicholas Crawford discussed contractor options.

Jon Swae invited the council to designate someone to stay in touch with and suggested coming back in three months with an update.
