MEETING MINUTES DRAFT

1. Call to Order and Roll Call.

The meeting was called to order at 8:40am.

2. Adoption of Minutes of the February 23, 2021 Urban Forestry Council Regular Meeting.

(Explanatory Document: February 23, 2021 Draft Minutes) (Discussion and Action)

There was no public comment.

Upon a motion from Member Troxel and a second from Member Sullivan, the minutes were approved unanimously.

3. General Public Comment: Members of the public may address the Council on matters that are within the Council's jurisdiction and are not on today's agenda.

There was no public comment.

4. Discussion of the Urban Forestry Council 2019 Strategic Plan goals and priorities. Speaker: Andrew Sullivan, Urban Forestry Council Chair. (Explanatory Document: UFC 2019 Strategic Plan) (Discussion and Possible Action)

Chair Sullivan asked if there were any updates on communications or other aspects of the strategic plan and mentioned his conversations around additional funding for urban forestry.

Member Polony said that she didn't have anything to add and said that she would work to schedule the next communications group meeting.

Member Troxel gave an update on mapping the City's canopy cover and ranking tracts that are in need of trees.

Chair Sullivan asked about missing data in particular neighborhoods.

Member Troxel confirmed that the saw cut data is missing from the Sunset and the Western Addition. He spoke about the data that contributed to the rankings.

Member Polony asked how many saw cut locations there are for the entire city.

Member Troxel said he would need to confirm.

Member Spigelman asked about the parameters for saw cut locations.

Member Troxel said that utility information was not used.

Member Flanagan said that thirty percent of saw cut locations tend to be compromised.

Member Spigelman asked if the Planning Department would be involved in identifying potential issues with future projects.

Vice Chair Crawford said that there is not a way to check this.

Member Troxel talked about preparing for future conversations with Supervisors.

Chair Sullivan mentioned other opportunities including private property.

Member Troxel said that more accurate data would be needed.

Chair Sullivan said it might depend on the neighborhood and suggested getting data on public and private opportunities to guide incentives and programs.

Member Hernandez-Gomez asked if this could be sent to the design review team at the Planning Department.

Member Troxel said that he would need to document his analysis.

Member Flanagan asked to clarify if Planning has jurisdiction over trees over 10 feet from the curb.

Member Hernandez-Gomez confirmed that they have jurisdiction over trees within 10 feet from the curb.

Member Sullivan complemented Blake on his work. He suggested looking at the City's rules for where saw cuts can exist.

Chair Sullivan mentioned that this should be brought to public works.

Member Troxel confirmed that there are not enough potential planting spots between the saw cut and identified potential locations.

Vice Chair Crawford confirmed the 10,000 cut sites and 30,000 potential sites. He spoke about the importance of using an equity lens and that there has been resistance to planting in front.

Chair Sullivan asked why it's difficult to plant trees in the Tenderloin.

Member Flanagan said that there are a lot of basements and vandalism of planted trees.

Member Hernandez-Gomez said this will be a helpful tool for prioritization.

Peter Brastow recommended making this agenda item more specific in the future.

Chair Sullivan agreed and suggested making more robust updates separate agenda items.

There was no public comment.

5. Presentation on the Presidio Historic Forest. Speaker: Blake Troxel, Presidio Trust (Discussion)

Member Troxel presented on the diversification project.

Member Sullivan asked about problems with the trees at Mount Sutro and asked if there are the same issues with monocultures in the Presidio.

Member Troxel said that there are and that they are testing other species of eucalyptus.

Member Nagle asked what criteria were used to decide which trees to remove.

Member Troxel said that everything was considered as well as spacing and canopy closure structure.

Member Flanagan asked how the remaining trees have performed.

Member Troxel said it might be too early to tell but that they should not have to compete for resources.

Member Keller asked about increased exposure.

Member Troxel said that there haven't been any major failures.

Member Vaisset-Fauvel said that he has seen minimal blow down.

Chair Sullivan asked about the understory planting with dust and leaf litter.

Member Troxel said that they had mature plants and hope that a majority will survive with little maintenance.

Peter mentioned that the lack of water might help with blow down.

Member Polony mentioned the similarities with Mount Sutro and suggested sharing data and best practices.

Member Xochitl asked if there will be work done to see if different species do better in other places.

Member Troxel said that there are some historical restrictions on what can be done with the tree canopy.

Chair Sullivan said that there is not a lot of commercial availability of certain eucalyptus.

Member Vaisset-Fauvel talked about his experience with planting understories and different types of eucalyptus.

There was no public comment.

6. Presentation on urban forestry management at Mount Sutro. Speaker: Morgan Vaisset-Fauvel, University of California, San Francisco. (Discussion)

Member Vaisset-Fauvel presented on his work at Mount Sutro.

Whitney Grover, Golden Gate Audubon, presented on the Mount Sutro Bird and Butterfly surveys.

Member Polony presented on work done by Sutro Stewards.

Member Troxel acknowledged that this site is more difficult than the Presidio.

Member Vaisset-Fauvel said that he would be getting additional data.

Chair Sullivan asked if there has been any infill in the canopies.

Member Vaisset-Fauvel said that it took 3 years for there to be a response in the 2018 cut. He said that this influenced the 2020 cut.

Public Comment Received via Phone:

The commenter asked about the use of fire to thin trees.

7. Committee Reports: (Discussion)

Planning & Funding Committee. Igor Lacan, Committee Chair.

Landmark Tree Ad Hoc Committee. Mike Sullivan, Committee Chair.

Peter gave an update on the Planning and Funding Committee and mentioned what was presented at the most recent meeting.

Member Sullivan said that there have been no new landmark tree nominations.

There was no public comment.

8. Staff Report. Peter Brastow, Urban Forestry Coordinator, San Francisco Department of the Environment (Discussion)

Peter discussed updating the landmark tree map and the coast live oak data collection.

Member Polony asked about the bio request sent to councilmembers.

Peter said that he has received a third of the bios.

Member Sullivan recommended emailing those who have not sent their bios.

There was no public comment.

9. Urban Forestry Council Member Announcements. (Discussion)

Member Crawford said that the 24th Street pruning and removal project has started.

Member Vaisset-Fauvel thanked Friends of the Urban Forest for planting 120 trees.

Member Crawford said that they planted a grove dedicated to victims of COVID-19 on Arbor Day.

10. New Business/Future Agenda Items. (Discussion and Possible Action)

Chair Sullivan discussed potential future agenda items.

Member Nagle said that there might be a biodiversity and street tree list update for the next meeting.

Peter said that there is no UFC meeting in April and the next meeting will be in May.

Member Vaisset-Fauvel asked if Member Lacan could give a presentation on disease at a future meeting.

11. Adjournment.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:03a.m.
