Northern rata (*Metrosideros robusta*), located at 1776 Vallejo Street, San Francisco, CA 94123; Assessor's Block 0552, Lot 031. (Explanatory Documents: Nomination Form)

Member Spiegelman asked if the tree was on the Burr property.

Gordon Matassa, Urban Forestry Coordinator, San Francisco Department of the Environment, discussed the location of the tree, the appearance of the tree and historic photos.

Member Hillan commended Gordon Matassa for outstanding research.

The property owner was not present.

Public Comment:

John Ryan discussed support for the nomination for Landmark Tree Status.

The committee discussed the trees rarity, physical size, historical attributes, environmental attributes and cultural attributes.

There was no staff rebuttal.

There was no property owner rebuttal.

Member Short asked what the property owner feels about the nomination.

Member Mike Sullivan asked if the nomination was out of concern about construction in progress near the tree.

Member Spigelman discussed concern about the trees integrity with the construction.

Member Swae discussed the trees historic connection to the Burr property.

Member Mike Sullivan discussed the rarity of the tree.

Member Hillan discussed the rarity of the tree.

The Committee discussed the possibility of codominant failure.

A motion by Member Hillan and second by Member Sullivan to find that the tree was eligible for landmark tree status failed. (Aye: Members Hillan and Mike Sullivan; Noes: Members Short, Spiegelman and Swae; Absent: None)

Member Short discussed consideration of structural integrity of trees by the Committee.

Member Swae discussed reviewing the landmark tree process of other cities including their evaluation forms.

Member Swae asked about the status of the discussion about plaques for landmark trees.
