- Biodiversity Resolution – Passed in April
- Zero Waste Hearing in May (Neighborhood Services)
- Annual Department Budget Hearing in May (Budget & Finance Committee)
- Cigarette Butt Litter Pilot Program Hearing in May (Neighborhood Services)
- Plastics and Litter Reduction Ordinance – Becomes Law in August
- CalRecycle Resolution – Passed in October
- Total A&E's – 3 Approved, 3 Pending
