Dear Commissioners:

I was pleased to see the [last slide of the Strategic Priorities FY 2022-2023](#) call for a \$3.2 million allocation from San Francisco's General Fund to address SFE's critical climate programs. Getting General Fund support for the first time ever in last years budget was a start, and this ask is essential to continue moving forward.

Please give this request your full support.

And there is still more to do. San Francisco's key actions to address climate change - from decarbonizing buildings to electrifying transport to supporting travel mode shifts to addressing the broad and diffuse problem of responsible consumption all involve activities at a number of city agencies - all of which need coordination across agencies, and all of which require funding. Implementing solutions in the private sector will require carefully designed financial support as well if we are to avoid placing undue burdens on households and small business.

That's why it's important for the Commission on the Environment to do more than just endorse SFE's current budget request. Please raise the importance of coordinated climate action - both mitigation and adaptation- with the Mayor, with the Supervisors, with your fellow commissioners at other agencies. Please support 1% for Climate Equity , and please be adamant in supporting the need for robust and inclusive public outreach as the various plans and projects are developed.

Thank you for voicing your support for addressing climate change, with funding to support the needed actions. Your role as Commissioners is crucial in ensuring effective Climate action.
