

1 [Resolution Making Findings to Allow Teleconferenced Meetings]

2 **Resolution making findings to allow teleconferenced meetings under California**
3 **government code section 54953(e)**
4

5 WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 54953(e) empowers local
6 policy bodies to convene by teleconferencing technology during a proclaimed
7 state of emergency under the State Emergency Services Act so long as certain
8 conditions are met; and
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10 WHEREAS, In March 2020, the Governor of the State of California
11 proclaimed a state of emergency in California in connection with the
12 Coronavirus Disease 2019 ("COVID-19") pandemic, and that state of
13 emergency remains in effect; and
14

15 WHEREAS, In February 25, 2020, the Mayor of the City and County of San
16 Francisco (the "City") declared a local emergency, and on March 6, 2020 the
17 City's Health Officer declared a local health emergency, and both those
18 declarations also remain in effect; and
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20 WHEREAS, On March 11 and March 23, 2020, the Mayor issued emergency
21 orders suspending select provisions of local law, including sections of the City
22 Charter, that restrict teleconferencing by members of policy bodies; those
23 orders remain in effect, so City law currently allows policy bodies to meet
24 remotely if they comply with restrictions in State law regarding teleconference
25 meetings; and
26

27 WHEREAS, On September 16, 2021, the Governor signed AB 361, a bill that
28 amends the Brown Act to allow local policy bodies to continue to meet by
29 teleconferencing during a state of emergency without complying with
30 restrictions in State law that would otherwise apply, provided that the policy
31 bodies make certain findings at least once every 30 days; and
32

33 WHEREAS, While federal, State, and local health officials emphasize the
34 critical importance of vaccination and consistent mask-wearing to prevent the
35 spread of COVID-19, the City's Health Officer has issued at least one order
36 (Health Officer Order No. C19-07y, available online at
37 www.sfdph.org/healthorders) and one directive (Health Officer Directive No.
38 2020-33i, available online at www.sfdph.org/directives) that continue to
39 recommend measures to promote physical distancing and other social
40 distancing measures, such as masking, in certain contexts; and
41

1 WHEREAS, The California Department of Industrial Relations Division of
2 Occupational Safety and Health ("Cal/OSHA") has promulgated Section 3205
3 of Title 8 of the California Code of Regulations, which requires most employers in
4 California, including in the City, to train and instruct employees about measures
5 that can decrease the spread of COVID-19, including physical distancing and
6 other social distancing measures; and
7

8 WHEREAS, Without limiting any requirements under applicable federal,
9 state, or local pandemic-related rules, orders, or directives, the City's
10 Department of Public Health, in coordination with the City's Health Officer, has
11 advised that for group gatherings indoors, such as meetings of boards and
12 commissions, people can increase safety and greatly reduce risks to the health
13 and safety of attendees from COVID-19 by maximizing ventilation, wearing well-
14 fitting masks (as required by Health Officer Order No. C19-07), using physical
15 distancing where the vaccination status of attendees is not known, and
16 considering holding the meeting remotely if feasible, especially for long
17 meetings, with any attendees with unknown vaccination status and where
18 ventilation may not be optimal; and
19

20 WHEREAS, On July 31, 2020, the Mayor issued an emergency order that,
21 with limited exceptions, prohibited policy bodies other than the Board of
22 Supervisors and its committees from meeting in person under any
23 circumstances, so as to ensure the safety of policy body members, City staff,
24 and the public; and
25

26 WHEREAS, the Urban Forestry Council Planning and Funding Committee
27 has met remotely during the COVID-19 pandemic and can continue to do so in
28 a manner that allows public participation and transparency while minimizing
29 health risks to members, staff, and the public that would be present with in-
30 person meetings while this emergency continues; now, therefore, be it
31

32 RESOLVED, That Urban Forestry Council Planning and Funding Committee
33 finds as follows:
34

- 35 1. As described above, the State of California and the City remain in a state
36 of emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic. At this meeting, the Urban
37 Forestry Council Planning and Funding Committee has considered the
38 circumstances of the state of emergency.
39
- 40 2. As described above, State and City officials continue to recommend
41 measures to promote physical distancing and other social distancing
42 measures, in some settings.

1 3. As described above, because of the COVID-19 pandemic, conducting
 2 meetings of this body in person would present imminent risks to the safety
 3 of attendees, and the state of emergency continues to directly impact
 4 the ability of members to meet safely in person; and, be it

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 6 FURTHER RESOLVED, That for at least the next 30 days meetings of the Urban
 7 Forestry Council Planning and Funding Committee will continue to occur
 8 exclusively by teleconferencing technology (and not by any in-person meetings
 9 or any other meetings with public access to the places where any policy body
 10 member is present for the meeting). Such meetings of the Urban Forestry
 11 Council Planning and Funding Committee that occur by teleconferencing
 12 technology will provide an opportunity for members of the public to address this
 13 body and will otherwise occur in a manner that protects the statutory and
 14 constitutional rights of parties and the members of the public attending the
 15 meeting via teleconferencing; and, be it

16
 17 FURTHER RESOLVED, That staff for the Urban Forestry Council Planning and
 18 Funding Committee is directed to place a resolution substantially similar to this
 19 resolution on the agenda of a future meeting of the Urban Forestry Council
 20 Planning and Funding Committee within the next 30 days. If the Urban Forestry
 21 Council Planning and Funding Committee does not meet within the next 30 days,
 22 staff is directed to place such a resolution on the agenda of the next meeting of
 23 the Urban Forestry Council Planning and Funding Committee.
