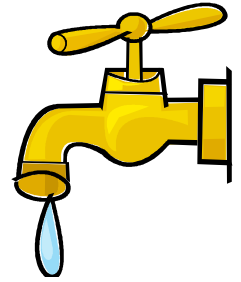
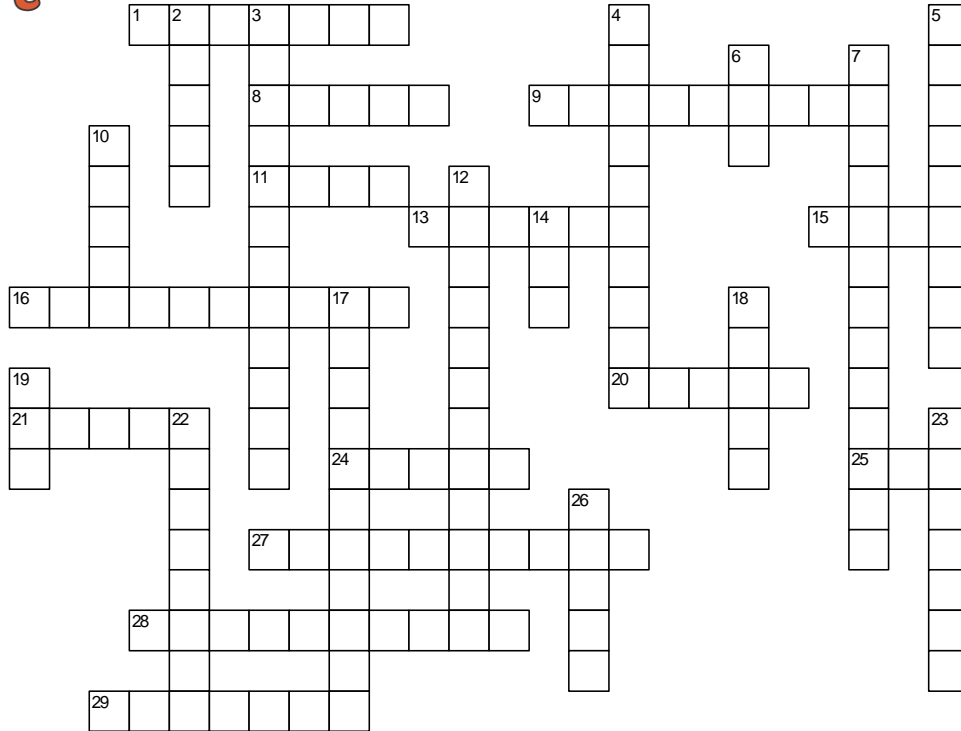


Water Cycle Crossword Fun!

- 1 This is a way of growing food that doesn't use poisonous chemicals called pesticides.
- 8 When water evaporates, it collects in this fluffy form before it rains.
- 9 Most of Earth's water is this type and human beings can't drink it.
- 11 This appears at nighttime and has an effect on the waters' tides.
- 13 Another name for "toxin."
- 15 These live in the ocean, breath through gills, and can get contaminated by water pollution.
- 16 Human beings can only drink this type of water.
- 20 The name of our planet.
- 21 When water evaporates from a boiling teakettle, it takes this form.
- 24 This is the largest body of water on Earth. There are 5 of them.
- 25 When water freezes it can take this form.
- 27 This can be used to hold groceries but when it becomes litter, sea animals might think it's a jellyfish and eat it.
- 28 This activity began in California in 1849 and caused a lot of dirt and mercury to end up in the San Francisco Bay.
- 29 A mammal that lives in the ocean, breathes oxygen and is very playful.

- 2 This flows from mountains and empties into lakes and seas.
- 3 The last part of the water cycle when water gathers or collects.
- 4 The name of the famous bridge in San Francisco that is dark orange.
- 5 This is the natural order of how living things get food. Plants are at the bottom of this and humans are at the top.
- 6 This body of water surrounds most of San Francisco.
- 7 Part of the water cycle. Another name for rain or snow.
- 10 The largest mammals in the world that live in the ocean. They also breathe oxygen.
- 12 Part of the water cycle when water collects in clouds after evaporating.
- 14 The star that creates heat on Earth so that water can evaporate.
- 17 Part of the water cycle when heat makes the water turn into steam or an invisible gas.
- 18 This covers more than 70% of the planet
- 19 The abbreviation of our country
- 22 This thick, black, liquid is used in our cars and if it gets washed down the storm drain, it can pollute our water.
- 23 This animal lives off the rocks in the San Francisco Bay and walks on its flippers.
- 26 When pesticides are used here to grow crops, the poisons can end up in our waterways.
