

1 **[CLIMATE GRANT AWARDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023]**
2 **Resolution approving Environment Department Funding Recommendations for**
3 **grants awards to 10 organizations during the fiscal year 2022-2023 grant cycle.**

5 WHEREAS, The Environment Department provides grant funding to
6 nonprofit groups to further the City's climate goals through robust community
7 engagement; and

8 WHEREAS, The Environment Department released a request for proposals
9 for climate grants on October 7, 2022, for projects related to building
10 decarbonization in environmental justice communities, SB 1383 compost
11 procurement, SB 1383 urban compost activation, general zero waste, pollution
12 prevention, healthy ecosystems, and youth education; and

13 WHEREAS, These grant-funded projects will help San Francisco achieve
14 the goals of the 2021 Climate Action Plan, as well as a range of co-benefits such as
15 creating jobs, providing classroom materials for educators, securing healthy food
16 for low-income San Franciscans, and building community; and

17 WHEREAS, The Environment Department regularly partners with the San
18 Francisco Unified School District on work orders to promote environmental
19 education to San Francisco students; and

20 WHEREAS, The Commission on the Environment approved amendments to
21 Resolution File No. 2022-08-COE on December 6, 2022, requiring the
22 Environment Department to receive Commission on the Environment approval
23 before executing any new outgoing grant requiring anticipated expenditures by the
24 Department of \$100,000 or more, or executing any amendment on an existing
25 outgoing grant that will cumulatively increase anticipated expenditures by 50% or
26 more and has an amended total of \$100,000 or more; now, therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That the Commission on the Environment approves the award
 2 of grants and work orders, totaling \$990,665, to be disbursed during fiscal year
 3 2022-2023 to the following organizations:
