3 Resolution approving Department of the Environment Funding Recommendations for
4 Zero Waste grant awards to eleven organizations.

5 WHEREAS, The Zero Waste grant program of the Department of the Environment
6 administers a grant program that provides funding to non-profit groups; and,

7 WHEREAS, the Zero Waste grant program is dedicated to funding projects that divert
8 waste from San Francisco's landfill, thereby assisting the City in achieving its goal of zero
9 waste by 2020, and achieving this at a low cost per ton of waste diverted; and

10 WHEREAS, in addition to helping San Francisco reach its zero waste goals, these
11 grant funded projects achieve a range of co-benefits such as creating jobs, providing
12 classroom materials for educators, securing healthy food for low-income San Franciscans and
13 building community; now, therefore, be it

14 RESOLVED, the Commission approves the award of Zero Waste grants, totaling
15 \$860,000 to be disbursed during FY 2015-2017 to the following organizations:
