3	Resolution recommending that the Board of Supervisors instruct the Planning		
4	Department to require a Tree Disclosure Statement as part of all building permit		
5	applications that include exterior work, demolition or grading.

7	WHEREAS, San Francisco has a relatively small percentage of large trees of high		
8	value, as documented by recently completed surveys (UFORE, 2005); and,		
9	WHEREAS, It takes many years for a tree to grow to a significant size and character;		
10	and,		
11	WHEREAS, Significant, valuable trees are frequently cut down for small and large		
12	developments with inadequate public process; and,		
13	WHEREAS, It is a tremendous loss to the surrounding neighborhood when such tree		
14	are cut down; and,		
15	WHEREAS, It is incumbent on the City to ensure and promote preservation of the		
16	existing tree canopy cover within the City Limits; and,		
17	WHEREAS, Properly identifying and mapping all trees within a proposed construction		
18	site is the first step in preserving these trees; and,		
19	WHEREAS, Promoting standards of maintenance required for the protection of the		
20	City's urban forest during and after demolition and construction is an effective way to ensure		
21	and promote preservation of such trees; now, therefore, be it		
22	RESOLVED, That the Urban Forest Council recommends that that the Board of		
23	Supervisors instruct the Planning Department to require that all building permit applications		
24	that include exterior work and all demolition or grading permit applications include a complete		
25	tree disclosure statement (see Exhibit A: example from City of Palo Alto); and, be it		

1	FURTHER RESOLVED, The Urban Forest Council recommends that the Board of		
2	Supervisors instruct the Planning Department to actively ensure and promote the survival of		
3	trees during construction events by providing protection standards and best management		
4	practices (see Exhibit A: example from City of Palo Alto); and, be it		
5	FURTHER RESOLVED, The Urban Forest Council recommends that the Board of		
6	Supervisors instruct the Planning Department to ensure that before development plans are		
7	approved, that the Developer agrees in writing to: a) inform all contractors of the City's		
8	requirement to preserve and protect landmark trees; and b) to provide the best management		
9	practices, procedures, and mitigation so that all parties to the development are held		
10	accountable for tree preservation and their protection during and after development; and, be i		
11	FURTHER RESOLVED, The Urban Forest Council recommends that the Board of		
12	Supervisors instruct the Planning Department to establish and maintain an up-to-date file of al		
13	"Tree Disclosure Statements", and make copies available to the public upon request, as		
14	governed by the City's Sunshine Laws.
